

Glossary Of Commonly Used Physical Therapy Terms

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physical therapy, aide (vocabulary) degeneration of a specific area of the brain that manufactures dopamine (a neurotransmitter) which results in resting tremors, progressing to weak, slow movements, finally rigidity and paralysis. mental capacity is preserved therapy terms. self-confidence the positive feeling of one's ability to accomplish any certain or general activities in life, in social, physical, work, or individual situations; a belief that one's self and capabilities are equal to most any task self-esteem the feeling of self-worth or self-love this glossary has many commonly used terms, but isn't a full list these glossary terms and definitions are intended to be educational and may be different from the terms and definitions in your plan. some of these terms also might not have exactly the same meaning when used in your policy or plan, and in any such case, the policy or plan governs common physical therapy abbreviations. when physical therapists document the progress of a patient, it's common for abbreviations to be made within the notes. rules vary depending on your facility, but it's common to use physical therapy abbreviations such as nwb (non weight bearing) or ad (assistive device). while the apta does not endorse the glossary is not a policy document on its own, but terms are added to wcpt's policy statements. terms have been fully referenced to original sources. where terms have been developed by wcpt they should be referenced to the wcpt glossary: world confederation for physical therapy. wcpt glossary: terms used in wcpt's policies and resources to rate in physical therapy - is a post-baccalaureate 3 year degree required to become a licensed physical therapist through the american physical therapy association. dpt - doctorate in physical therapy. dysphagia - is the medical term for the symptom of difficulty in swallowing. although classified under "symptoms and signs" in icd-10, the term

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
